

You may have seen the posters about the 300 club or be one of the 50-60 people who have joined already. You may have even been one of our lucky winners, but if you haven't joined in and want to know more, please keep reading.

What is the 300 Club?

It is a lottery that the club are running. It costs £2 per week which is taken directly from your bank account each Wednesday. Half of the money goes to the club and half of the money goes into the prize fund. There are two prizes each week with the split as 50% club, 35% 1st prize and 15% 2nd prize. If there are 100 entries, then the prize split would be £100 club, £70 1st prize and £30 2nd prize. Any rollovers boost the 1st and 2nd prize the next week with the club having none of the rollover money. The draw takes place down the club each Tuesday night with the drawer and the witness being different people each week. The winnings are then paid into your bank account.

What is the money for?

The money is going into club funds to be used on anything that the committee decides necessary. We thought it was better to be flexible than keep having to announce different projects. The money could be used for things such as repairs/improvements to the scoreboards or other club equipment, new equipment to further develop the kitchen hatch, new bowls for

juniors or beginners, coaching equipment, improved prize money for leagues, etc. Anything that the committee thinks will improve the club for you, the members.

How do I join?

In an evening, please speak to Dan Mills or Kevin Ekins. Unfortunately, they are busy working during the day so if you only play in the daytime, please speak to one of the other committee members who you do see. You just need your bank card and we can help to fill the form in.

This is a great and easy way to raise money for the club but we need your support.

Club Shirts

For the last two seasons, many of you will have noticed the club shirts sponsored by Bridgestone Tyres and Roythornes Solicitors. These were brought in to help modernise the game and make it more appealing to the younger generation. To date, they have only been worn in national team competitions.

It has previously been raised that the shirts worn in county leagues and friendly matches are becoming a bit outdated, and we have explored the option of new club shirts for these matches only.



Alan Tokley kindly conducted a consultation on potential new shirts, which proved extremely useful and informative, but it was then discussed about there being multiple club shirts and the costs involved to our members. Our ladies have already made the decision to use the "Spalding Lightning" shirts this season in the Trudy Bates and the juniors are delighted to also follow suit. Some sponsorship has also been found to help them get fully kitted out. Therefore, after much discussion, your Management Committee have decided that the "Spalding Lightning" shirts will be rolled out to all club representative teams from the 2025/26 season.

We are one club and we feel that now is the time to have one club shirt. Other local clubs like Boston, Sleaford and most recently Lincoln, have all got new fashionable and appealing kits and we feel that this is a good way to move the club forward.

We appreciate that bowls clothing can be expensive, but it is the club's intention to subsidise towards the new shirts to make it more cost effective for our members.
